

Charlie's New Project

As I mentioned in my President's Message, I've taken on another project in my garage, a very rare 82 TR8 I purchased in November from the original owner in Vancouver. Unfortunately that owner drove it during the winter and every corner of the car has rusted fenders along with rust at the top of the struts and rusted out sills. Amazingly though, the floor and remainder of the car underneath are solid and the interior is in good shape. Normally a car like this would be a scrap heap car for me however, in the TR8 world, it is well known that there were only 70 1982 TR8s built in the last year of production of 1981. That year also, there were only a total of 414 cars actually built. So in the Triumph world and particularly the wedge world 81 and 82 TR8s are the rarest of all. 82s being the rarest of them. Incidentally, all the 82s were sent to Canada due to US emissions requirements. What makes this even more interesting is in the list of 70 - 82s that is out there, somehow this car's VIN is not on the list as an 82 but rather listed as an 81. Therefore, this makes a change in the history of 82's to now

be 71 and not 70. Eventually I'm going to put that out to the wedge heads and see what kind of feedback I get from the "experts" on my FB groups. There are some real know-it-alls on these Facebook groups. They'll argue up and down that this car is not an 82 even though I can prove it. LOL! Ergo, that's the reason for actually attempting to restore this. I'm sure most of you don't follow the TR8s as I, and some of the other members with TR8s, do but a rare 82 TR8 just sold on the bring a trailer auction site for \$33,500 US dollars. The 82 I already had had an accident this past summer but I ended up getting \$30,000 clear from ICBC and was able to keep the car. So the value for the 82 is up there. Wish me luck on this restoration. Currently working on seeing if the motor is any good.





Triumph at the 2023 RAC Rally

Since printing the article on Joan Richmond in the December newsletter, I've had the pleasure of exchanging e-mails and information with Dave Webster, the editor of the newsletter for the Pre-1940 Triumph Motor Club in the UK. In one of his recent e-mails he pointed out to me videos of the 2023 RAC Rally held in November last year.

Dave was due to be part of the support crew for a Triumph TR7 V8 driven by Chris Ingram/ Hannah McKillop in one of the later stages. Chris is a successful British rally car diver and became the first Brit to win the European Championship in 52 years in 2019. His car was one of a batch of 6 car built by Dave Appleby Engineering to full FIA Appendix K rules. Luck was not with him on this rally, though, as he had to retire due to mechanical problems. As a result, Dave

missed out on the opportunity.

There was another Triumph TR7 V8 entered, one driven by by Frank Tundo/Alan Jones. That TR7 finished in 65th place behind a whole herd of Ford Escorts with a few other makes thrown in.

I was commenting to Bryan the other day that Escorts were a popular and very successful rally car when I lived in the UK 50 years ago. The newer models seem to be carrying on the tradition. This seems to be one thing that Ford got right.

There was also a Lancia Stratos in the race, but that suffered the same fate as Chris's car.

v=VE-3pxIEruk. It is well worth watching just for the sound of the TR7 and the Stratos. *Ed.*





Every year, for the past 36 years, the Vancouver ABFM organizers have been inspired by the sight of so many enthusiasts who faithfully make the time and effort to enter and display their classic British cars and bikes on the lawns of the magnificent VanDusen Botanical Garden.

Equally inspiring is the increasing number of enthusiasts who arrive at the entrance gate to enjoy what is known as *The Greatest Show on British Wheels*. That's encouraging because it confirms that the classic car hobby is alive and growing here in Western Canada despite ongoing, disruptive elements affecting the key staging locations for Vancouver events.

On the announcement of the 37th Vancouver ABFM (All British Field Meet), the organizers take this opportunity to thank all supporters, the keepers of these beautiful machines, the admirers who gather faithfully to observe, be inspired and pay homage to the cultural heritage of the assembled displays, and importantly, the financial support of sponsors and vendors.


Family Memberships


